Trending UP

- More items were borrowed from the library in 2011 than ever before—a record-breaking 1.96 million.
- Customers can place more holds on their account, up to 75 from 50 items. It's now easier to place holds online using the library's new website and the free BPLMobile app for mobile devices.
 The result: customers placed 25% more holds last year.
- eBook loans continued to climb: loans were 62% up. eBooks represent 3% of everything borrowed last year.
- Lots of gamers liked when the popular Nintendo DS and 3DS games joined our collection: 26% more video games were borrowed in 2011.







Trending UP

- DVDs remained a popular choice for library users, with a 10% increase over 2010.
- We're plugged-in to our mobile customers. Over 3,400 people used the new BPLMobile app in 2011 and 8% of online visits to the library were made from mobile devices like phones and tablets.
- WiFi is BIG and getting bigger. Wifi use doubled in the second half of 2011, so we increased the library's capacity to handle the demand.
- We launched a new collection of popular adult graphic novels and made them easier to find. Teens and kids borrowed graphic novels 23% more than in 2010.







UP Sizing and Sprucing UP

- Aldershot Branch settled into its bigger, brighter, and brand new location in late 2011. Residents young and old, together with Councillor Rick Craven, MPP Jane McKenna, Library Board members and staff, came out to applaud a job well done at our Grand Opening celebration on Friday, January 13. The new branch had nearly 5 times as many people registering for new library cards in January 2012 compared to January 2011.
- New Appleby Branch now sports a refreshed new look, with colourful walls and some new furnishings.
- In a hurry? You can now check out items quickly and easily using the new self-checkout station at New Appleby and Aldershot branches.

Did you know?... Our self-checkout stations offer four language options: English, French, Spanish, and Chinese.





UP Sizing and Sprucing UP

 Fast – easy – friendly. We launched our new website and introduced convenience features such as a dynamic library events calendar, online customer feedback forms, and an enhanced catalogue that allows members to share reviews and connect with others.

 Impulse borrowing is good! It's easier to find those 'hidden gems' in our collection with high-interest displays at all locations.

- Library visitors get up-to-the-minute information about library events and programs on the new **digital signage** at Aldershot branch and Central Library.
- All locations now have new desktop computers with widescreen viewing and newer versions of popular software. Computers with Internet access and popular software are free to use.
- Together with the City of Burlington, the library upgraded its **phone system**.

It seems like only yesterday that **Tansley Woods Branch Library** was the new kid on the block, opening 15 years ago on September 14, 1996.

This landmark facility was:

- our **first** library construction project since 1975
- our first new branch since 1968
- our first built (not leased) branch, and
- our first joint project with the City of Burlington Parks and Recreation Department.

In 2011, this busy branch accounted for:

- nearly 30% of all borrowing system-wide
- over 30% of all visitors to Burlington Public Library
- over 25% of all reference questions asked





Grown UP and Growing UP

We've come a long way since then

Fast-forward fifteen years to October 27, 2011 and the official groundbreaking of the Library's newest branch location—and the city's largest joint community project.

The Alton community complex in northeast Burlington, housing three state-of-the-art facilities— a community centre, a high school, and a joint integrated public and school library—is expected to open in fall 2013.

Gardens, The Red Canoe Bistro, and Port Nelson United Church.


 Heritage Month launch site and host of the Burlington Heritage Fair, with 17 local heritage groups participating.

Statement of Operations Year Ending December 31, 2011




