Your public library is a busy place—2.1% more people came into the library last year than in 2012. That's more than one person entering the library every minute we were open! Thanks for making BPL such a popular community destination.

Enquiring minds asked lots of questions—over 100,000 information questions were asked last year system-wide, an increase of 3.1%, confirming that library staff are still the best search engines around!





The new **Tumblr** site for teens launched in spring 2013.






The new **library catalogue** launched mid-year with features you asked for in a website survey, such as one-stop searching that integrates online articles in your search. Later in 2014, convenience expands to include searchable library program listings and online program registration!

Thanks to the new catalogue's **mobile-friendly** platform, we retired BPLMobile, so you no longer need to download an app to browse the collection, access your library account, and connect to the library's social media sites using your mobile device.

From author talks to ukulele lessons—you have it all at your library. In 2013, **50,352** people attended a library program—that's a **16.4%** jump over 2012.

Top billed programs: One Book One Burlington, author visits, Exam Cram Study Hall, and Paws 4 Stories.

Exam Cram Study Hall was a huge hit at all locations, attracting 1,664 students in January and 1,078 in June.

The joint integrated library, located and operated together with the Dr. Frank J. Hayden Secondary School Library, opened its doors on **September 30** after nearly four years in the making.



- ** Includes non-capitalized collection materials of \$276,474 and \$170,194 respectively for 2013 and 2012 and non-capitalized Equipment and Repair expenses of \$50,409 and \$26,178 respectively for 2013 and 2012.
